# Sally's Baking Addiction Cooks Up Web Success With WP Engine

## The Site

Sally's Baking Addiction ([sallysbakingaddiction.com](http://sallysbakingaddiction.com)) is a wildly popular baking blog that started as a hobby and a place for writer, recipe developer, and photographer Sally McKenney to share recipes with friends. Quickly, it evolved into a go-to site for baking enthusiasts where McKenney shares recipes and offers step-by-step insight into her kitchen creations, accompanied by mouthwatering photos. McKenney's pictures, which she shares via social media, dramatically increased the visibility of her blog. Today, sallysbakingaddiction.com has 7 million visitors per month and generates enough revenue that it is now McKenney's full-time job (along with writing cookbooks, the second of which is coming soon).



## The Challenge

The traffic for sallysbakingaddiction.com came swiftly. As more people stormed the site for the latest confections, the site's speed, scale, and uptime became imperative. At the hobby stage, McKenney was less concerned about overall site performance, but once the site became a full-time job and started generating 7 million visitors per month, the site demanded top-notch performance.

"I want the site to run fast, and accommodate growth in traffic," McKenney said.

But disaster struck the day before Thanksgiving in 2014 – a day when average the traffic to sallysbakingaddiction.com typically doubles. The site, which McKenney was hosting with a provider other than WP Engine, crashed and was unavailable.

"People were upset. They needed their pumpkin pie recipe," she said.

McKenney said she couldn't give a straight answer about why the site was down - on a day when many people are planning their baking regimen for Thanksgiving Day. Eventually, McKenney said, she was told the downtime was her fault.

"It was a nightmare," she said. "I had no control over it."

All told, the site was down for 10 hours – resulting in lost revenue and angered visitors. To get it back up, McKenney was forced to remove ads from the site, which resulted in an additional revenue hit. And even then, the site was still sluggish.
